LSUA and CLTCC Sign 2+2 Articulation MOU



 LSUA of Alexandria have signed a 2+2 Business Articulation” memorandum of understanding (MOU) with the Central Louisiana Community College on March 31, 2022. The MOU ensures a clear pathway from CLTCC’s Associate of Science in Business Administration to LSUA’s Bachelor of Science in Business Administration.

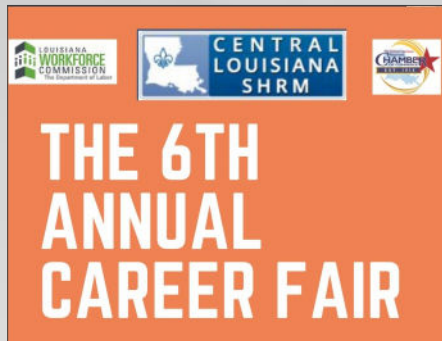
CLTCC graduates in Associate of Science in Business Administration who apply and are admitted to LSUA can transfer all 60 of their earned hours to LSUA’s Bachelor of Science in Business Administration.

“CLTCC students entering LSUA’s Business Administration program can specialize in a variety of concentrations such as management, marketing, entrepreneurship, financial analysis, international business, information systems, and agribusiness,” said College of Business Dean, Dr. Randall Dupont.

Dr. Heather Poole, Executive Vice Chancellor of Academic Affairs at CLTCC says, “Many students enter CLTCC with the intent of transferring from our community college to a 4-year college. Unfortunately, the path to college graduation can be challenging for some students.”

“Our goal at LSUA is to reach every CENLA student we can who is interested in pursuing a career requiring a 4-year degree,” said LSUA Chancellor Paul Coreil. “Partnering with CLTCC to achieve this goal is a significant step forward that will result in major benefits to students and to advancing workforce development across the region.”

Position Overview:

Responsibilities include safely operating production equipment used to make plywood; troubleshooting mechanical issues; actively participating in problem-solving sessions; producing a quality product and required efficiencies consistently; and cross-training on different machine centers.

Pay Rate: The starting pay for production team members at RoyOMartin-Plywood is \$15.50 per hour, with the ability to earn up to \$23.00 per hour through on-the-job training.

***New hires will receive a \$1,500 signing bonus! (\$750 after completing 6 months of employment, and \$750 after completing one year.)**

Schedule: RoyOMartin production facilities operate 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, with most production team members working a 12-hour shift. Individuals must be able to work rotating shifts (including holidays) and must be available for scheduled and unscheduled overtime as conditions of employment.
