We currently have over 580 recruiting announcements and work to help companies find the qualified staff they are seeking. Workforce Opportunity Grant Available



The Rapides Foundation's Workforce Opportunity Grant provides up to \$75,000 to support collaborations tween industry and postsecondary insti-

between industry and postsecondary institutions to offer training for high-wage occupations for which there is demonstrated unmet employer demand. Grants will be awarded to accredited, nonprofit, postsecondary institutions to provide short-term trainings (up to twelve months) to benefit businesses and employees located within The Rapides Foundation's nine-parish ser-(Allen, Avoyelles, Catahoula, vice area Grant, LaSalle, Natchitoches, Rapides, Vernon and Winn parishes).

Industry partners will be responsible for: 1) identifying qualifications, skills, certifications and credentials needed for high-wage jobs; 2) identifying a postsecondary partner to implement trainings for those skills; 3) a commitment to hire training participants or moderately increase the wages of existing employees that are trained; and 4) providing at least a 10% cash match for the total cost of the training.

The grant opportunity is part of the Foundation's Economic Development Initiative.

Beyond Graduation is a project designed to address the gap between high school seniors that graduate and apply to postsecondary institutions and those that enroll in their first fall semester. It is funded by a grant from The Rapides Foundation.

Beyond Graduation will fund trained career coaches to assist high school students with successfully transitioning to a local twoyear or four-year university or technical community college. Initially, the project will work with students in three school districts (LaSalle, Natchitoches and Rapides), with future plans to expand to all nine Cenla school districts (Allen, Avoyelles, Catahoula, Grant, LaSalle, Natchitoches, Rapides, Vernon, and Winn) depending on the success of the two-year pilot program. The project will fund staff at participating postsecondary institutions to provide ongoing services to Beyond Graduation students during their college tenure to ensure that they continue to progress towards comple-Participating Colleges/Universities: Central Louisiana Technical Community College (CLTCC), LSU of Alexandria (LSUA) and Northwestern State University (NSU).

Eligible students from LaSalle, Natchitoches or Rapides parish who plan to attend CLTCC, LSUA or NSU and meet ONE of the following criteria: First-generation college student (parent did not graduate from college); Economic hardship; Academic record and related factors (including attendance and disciplinary referrals).

U.S. Department of Commerce Invests \$1 Million In Cares Act Recovery Assistance to Establish Resiliency Center in Alexandria, Louisiana

The Department's Economic Development Administration (EDA) is awarding a \$1 million CARES Act Recovery Assistance grant to the Kisatchie-Delta Regional Planning and Development District in Alexandria Louisiana to create a new Resiliency Center that will support economic de-

velopment in the region. This EDA grant is

anticipated to maintain 891 jobs.

"This EDA investment in the Kisatchie-Delta Regional Planning and Development District will support business development and growth, creating a more resilient regional economy," Secretary of Commerce Gina M. Raimondo, said.

Assistant Secretary of Commerce for Economic Development,

Alejandra Y. Castillo, Assistant Secretary of Commerce for Economic Development, also said that, "The Resiliency Center to be established with the assistance of this EDA investment will serve as a multi-regional, multifaceted resilience and capacity-building facility supporting economic development in Central Louisiana."

-DCFS Workforce Development

Last summer, DCFS created a Workforce Development section dedicated to developing services and opportunities to engage, train and employ participants receiving FITAP (Family Independence Temporary Assistance Program) and SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program).

—Work-eligible FITAP recipients and SNAP recipients are provided services through STEP (Strategies to Empower People) and SNAP E&T. Expansion of DCFS portfolio to include the Child Support Enforcement Employment and Training (CSE E&T) Program.

—SNAP E&T initiative offers SNAP recipients in Louisiana the opportunity to gain skills, training and work experience.

- •Funded by the U.S. Department of Agriculture Food and Nutrition.
- The program is provided at no cost to SNAP recipients.
- •Employment and Training providers are eligible for federal reimbursement.

Work Opportunity Tax Credits (WOTC)

WOTC is one tool in a diverse toolbox of flexible strategies designed to help move people into gainful employment and obtain on -the-job experience. It joins other tax credits, education, and workforce training and development programs that help American workers with barriers to employment prepare for good jobs; case their transition from job to job; benefit from the creation of effective regional economic development strategies; and create high performance

The Louisiana Workforce Commission (LWC) offers bonding services for hard-toplace job seekers under the Fidelity Bonding Program. The federal bonding program provides insurance to employers that protects against employee dishonesty and acts as an incentive to hire at -risk applicants, including Returning Citizens offenders). Fidelity Bonding covers theft, forgery, larceny and embezzlement. Bond insurance issued ranges from \$5,000 - \$25,000 for a 6-month period with no deductible. The bond can be issued to employers once the applicant has received a job offer with a scheduled start date. For more information,

- There were 61,950 employed in the Alexandria metro area in July 2021, an increase of 1,295 from June. July 2021 recorded the highest employment level since July 2016.
- At 4.3%, the Alexandria MSA had the lowest rate among state's major metro areas for the 15th straight month, down 0.8% from the previous month.
- Statewide average weekly initial unemployment claims filed in August fell to 2,260 from 4,134 in July, a -45% decrease.
- After Hurricane Ida, initial claims rose from 2,061 on August 28 to 14,056 on September 11, up to 582%.
