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Louisiana's seasonally adjusted employed data reaches the highest number ever recorded for the month of June

Data released on July 21st by the federal Bureau of Labor Statistics shows that Louisiana's seasonally adjusted number of employed is the highest ever seen in the month of June, and the 2nd highest in series history.

The number of seasonally adjusted employed for June 2023 is 2,037,445. The number of employed saw a loss of 1,937 individuals from the May revised estimate of 2,039,382, but, compared to June 2022, the number of seasonally adjusted employed individuals increased by 20,020. This is the 27th consecutive month with an over-the-year gain in the number of employed.

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for June 2023 is 3.6 percent. The rate is tied for the second-lowest rate in series history. The rate shows no change from the May 2023 figure but increased by 0.1 percentage points from June 2022.





Preventing a Disaster Drive

Cenla CAC embarks upon a new project called "Prevent A Disaster Drive (PAD) Initiative that promotes life-sustaining services to Cenla residents. Every year, the summer months and hurricane season pose treats to seniors and disables community. This year alone, precious lives were lost due to excessive heat. During hurricanes Laura and Ida, more than 16 people died from excessive heat due to power outages. Two key issues stand out: 1) excessive heat and 2) power outages. The PAD Initiative will provide households who lack the resources to equip themselves with life-sustaining devices to help provide relief during the aforementioned emergencies.

Success Stories WIOA Adult Training Program

K. Ryland is a 22-year-old, single female resident of Rapides Parish. When she first started the WIOA Adult program in October 2021, she was pursuing a BS degree in Radiologic Science at NSU with GPA of 3.932. Her anticipated graduation was May of 2023. Throughout college, she relied on scholarships, grants, and her part time job, working toward her degree. During the clinical phase of her studies, her time spent in class had exponentially increased and had intensified, such that she was only able to work her part-time job as a waitress, on the weekends, making \$2.15 an hour plus tips. When she was a senior in high school, she was deemed a "homeless youth". She continued her schooling while working full-time. She was able to save enough to purchase a used manufactured home so that she could create a stable environment for herself. Last year, her car engine had a cracked head and was not repairable. She was forced to immediately purchase a used car to travel to class and work. This created a large financial obligation that was unforeseen. She also paid monthly rental on her lot, car insurance, cellphone bill, gasoline, and other day to day expenses. The additional financial burden of the car payment, combined with having less availability to work, caused Kylie to be in a financial crisis. With the help of the WIOA adult program, Kylie was able to finish her college career with a BS in Radiologic Science from NSU in May 2023. She received her ARRT license and moved to Shreveport where she is working at Willis Knighton Medical Center as a Rad Tech.

SunGas Renewables Chooses Rapides Parish for Proposed \$1.8 Billion Clean Fuel Facility

SunGas Renewables, an independent division of GTI Energy, announced it is considering an investment of approximately \$1.8 billion to establish a renewable low-carbon methanol production facility in Rapides Parish. The company projects its Pineville facility, Beaver Lake Renewable Energy (BLRE), would manufacture nearly 400,000 metric tons of green methanol per year for SunGas customers worldwide.

If the project moves forward as outlined, the company expects to create 109 new direct jobs with an average annual salary of more than \$78,000. SunGas also anticipates the creation of about 1,150 construction jobs at peak construction. Louisiana Economic Development estimates the project would result in an additional 390 new indirect jobs, for a total of 499 new jobs in central Louisiana.

"As the only state in the Gulf South with a climate action plan, Louisiana is a global leader in the energy transition and companies like SunGas Renewables have taken notice," Gov. John Bel Edwards said. "I applaud SunGas Renewables for pursuing this massive investment that would create quality, high-paying jobs in central Louisiana for our talented workers. If it moves forward, this project will be another milestone in our efforts to grow and diversify our economy. The state will continue to support the company's efforts to bring it to completion."

Louisiana's Not Seasonally Adjusted Unemployment Rate a Record Low for June

Data released on July 28th by the Louisiana Workforce Commission shows that Louisiana's not seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for June 2023 is 4.4 percent. This is the lowest rate for the month of June in series history. The rate shows an increase of 0.5 percentage points from the May 2023 rate of 3.9 percent but a decrease of 0.1 percentage points from June 2022.


Since May 2023, the number of not seasonally adjusted employed individuals has decreased by 3,824 to 2,020,568 in June 2023. This is the second-highest number of not seasonally adjusted employed individuals for the month of June in series history. Compared to June 2022, the number of not seasonally adjusted employed individuals increased by 6,270.
